

The Pastor's Notebook from the desk of Pastor Garret

This begins the season of Lent. Lent is a forty day season in the church year that we typically refer to as lowliness of life. The mark of dust is about communion, and be marked by ashes.

Perhaps you have celebrated Ash Wednesday in the past, but perhaps for some this is altogether a strange service. I remember going to the gym following an Ash

Wednesday service and receiving strange looks as to why I had a black smudge on my forehead.

The roots of this practice can be found in two experiences shared by people in the Old Testament. People would put dust on their head when some calamity happened and when they wanted to mark themselves as lowly. It was also used as a marker of people who knew they needed to make a change, so they would put on sackcloth and throw ashes upon their head.

Christians begin the 40 day season of Lent, which is a season of preparation for celebrating the risen Christ on Easter morning, by being marked with ashes. Thus, in this mark of ash we remember and proclaim three things for our Lenten journey: I am human, I am lowly, I am of Christ.

The mark of dust harkens back to the moment of creation when God knelt to make man out of the dust. It is a moment that suggests that we are created, we are not self-made. We are made for intimate connection and reliance upon God for life. And God calls our humanness, "good." So Lent is about celebrating who we are as created beings of an incredible Creator! It is about reflecting on and celebrating the wonderfully complex truth: I am human.

The mark of dust is most obviously about the the parts of our life and this world we actively lament to God. The mark of dust is about our lament for the dreams that are dashed or the ways life can change for the worse in an instant; for the ways we wish we could take back

> some of the things we said or did, but know we can't go back; for the ways we feel dead inside or lack purpose; for the broken relationships and families and communities; for the injustices in this world that seem to taunt us and those that go unnoticed. The mark of dust says: I am lowly; this world is broken.

The mark is about the delight of being human and the struggles we face. In this way, the message of Ash Wednesday can appeal to any person who is scattered

across the four winds of this world.

Last of all, we believe that this smudge of dirt is a hopeful thing. We are marked by a cross. The cross is the way God chooses to make Godself known in this world. So that whenever someone saw a cross-this horrible instrument of torture developed by humans-they might remember the way God shared in all that we are--our humanity and our sorrows. To be marked with the cross of dust is a declaration: I am of Christ. I am of the God who made me wonderfully well, who shared our sorrow, and who points us to a future that is unimaginably more than we could ever ask or imagine.

We share the dust because we share in the life of Jesus--his humanity, his sorrows, his hopeful future. May this Lent be an opportunity for you to come home to your own heart and to God.

Little did I know the history.

'Tis Winter Now, the Fallen Snow

Author: Samuel Longfellow

'Tis winter now; the fallen snow has left the heavens all coldly clear; through leafless boughs the sharp winds blow, and all the earth lies dead and drear.

And yet God's love is not withdrawn; his life within the keen air breathes; his beauty paints the crimson dawn, and clothes each branch with glittering wreaths.

And though abroad the sharp winds blow, and skies are chill, and frosts are keen, home closer draws her circle now, and warmer glows her light within.

O God, you give the winter's cold, as well as summer's joyous rays, you warmly in your love enfold, and keep us through life's wintry days.

Samuel Longfellow, B. A., brother of the Poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, was born at Portland, Maine, June 18, 1819, and educated at Harvard, where he graduated in Arts in 1839, and in Theology in 1846. 

Lynnwood Reformed Church Director of Faith Formation Position Description

Position Vision and Overview

The Director of Faith Formation supports the ministry of Lynnwood Reformed Church through leadership and facilitation of faith formation. *The Director of Faith Formation gives focused attention to faith formation at Lynnwood by chairing the Faith Formation Team and leading them to carry out their mission and vision for people of all ages, with specific attention to youth.*

The Director of Faith Formation is a part time, approximately 20 hours per week position (some of which are on the weekend) and is supervised and supported by Lynnwood's Minister of Word and Sacrament and consistory representative to the Faith Formation Team. Compensation for this position is \$20-\$25/hr, based on experience. If you are interested please email resume and cover letter to personnel@lynnwoodreformed.org.

Job Responsibilities:

Faith Formation Team

- Chairs the team
- Prepares for meetings by creating an agenda and making sure minutes are accurately taken and sent to the Office Manager to be put in the Consistory packet

LRC Youth

- Maps out schedule for the ministry year and summer
- Communicates with parents about events, forms, etc.
- Plans and leads youth groups
- Plans and leads youth retreat
- Coordinates any meals made at youth group
- Forms relationships with parents and youth that foster belonging
- Inquires if youth would like to participate in the process of Profession of Faith

Community Youth Group

- Connects with the Altamont Reformed Church youth representative (currently Pastor Matthew) to coordinate Youth Group times, schedule, and ideas.
- Is responsible for planning and leading the Community Youth Group.

Safe Sanctuary Team

- Collects forms yearly from parents
- Helps with yearly training

Sunday School

- Organizes Sunday School yearly schedule and curriculum for Explorations (K-5th grade) and Discipleship (6th-12th grade)
- Coordinates teachers and substitutes
- Coordinates Christmas Pageant and Celebration Sunday
- Assists in leading Profession of Faith Class

Small Groups Ministry

• Works in cohort with the Faith Formation Team and Pastor to coordinate a small group ministry for the church community.

Worship

• Helps lead parts of the liturgy as gifts and ability allow; especially with youth and children.

Social Media

• Works with the Pastor and Office Manager to maintain the church's social media accounts.

Description

Lynnwood Reformed Church is seeking a qualified candidate to coordinate multiple office functions in support of pastoral work, church committees and teams, congregants, and outside groups involved in the life of the church. The Office Manager has knowledge of and is familiar with how churches conduct business and perform services of worship. They have direct contact with members, leaders,

other staff, and daily contact with the pastor to whom they report directly. They demonstrate professional conduct, sensitivity and discretion in communications and interactions as they reflect heavily on the reputation and public image of the church.

Major Responsibilities

Performs multiple communications tasks including primary responsibility for creation of monthly newsletters, Sunday bulletins, visual media for worship, social media postings, website postings, printed reports.

- Works with staff and church member volunteers from Teams/Committees within the church for special reports, updates, publishing the Annual Church Directory, maintaining certain financial records including receiving invoices and reimbursement requests, review for accuracy and forward to offsite bookkeeping service.
- Maintains the church calendar.
- Manages the use of the property and interior space (facility) for various groups, member events and community events.
- Oversees the filing system and records management to ensure both accessibility and security backups to electronic files and records.
- Administrative Assistant for the pastor. Also, assist church staff and church leadership members as needed.
- Provides coordination and reminders to all people participating in worship, with printed readings, announcements, etc.
- Office functions receives calls and mail and routes correspondence to intended parties. Orders church supplies for office, custodian, and committees/teams needing church-purchased goods and services.

Requisite Skills

- General knowledge of Christian faith and church administration
- Excellent organizational skills
- Excellent communication skills (spoken and written), can write clearly with good grammar and spelling. Excellent phone etiquette.
- Computer proficiency needed, MS Word, MS Publisher, and Microsoft Office/Excel tools essential. Knowledge of Breeze and MediaShout software is a plus.
- Social media skills with Facebook and Instagram.
- Knowledgeable with office copier, phones, basic networking
- High School graduate with two years of either college or business school training
- Five years secretarial or managerial experience is desirable.
